RIDING IN CARS WITH DOGS....

Summer is rapidly approaching and we are already seeing some days when it has been too warm to take your pet with you for a ride to the store. But, how warm is too warm?

These studies of a car's temperature (below) were conducted by the Animal Protection Institute, were conducted using a car parked in a *shaded area*, with the windows totally closed, with 4 windows cracked and with 2 windows cracked. This study was done over a 3 day period.

Studies show that even on comparatively cool days, such as 72 degrees, a car's internal temperature will rocket to 116 degrees within 60 minutes *if left in the sun.*

A dog's normal body temperature is between 99.5 and 102.5. Their core temperature can reach higher than that very quickly if left in a vehicle which can lead to heat stroke and even death. At a temperature of 105 degrees they will need veterinary care, including an IV, in order to survive.

Treat your animal the same way you would treat yourself. If it is too hot to sit in a car that has been turned off or if it is too hot to sit outside in the sun with no water or shade then consider that it is too hot for your pet too. Consider that they wear their coats all year round.

The exception to that policy is if the animal is too young to be altered and then the new family must provide a pre-paid receipt for the Spay/Neuter from a Veterinary Clinic.

Wags does ask for a small adoption donation for the animals that are adopted. That donation does not cover the cost of the Spay/Neuter and feeding and care of these rescued dogs and cats. So far we have been able to rescue over 660 animals.

This event will include a Silent Auction, a Karaoke contest, catering by Donna Menard and Classic Events Catering, beer and wine etc. We will also have entertainment by emcee Jenifer Wilde and auctioneer Paul Newman. Anybody who has seen Paul will want to attend. For those of you that haven't you will want to attend. 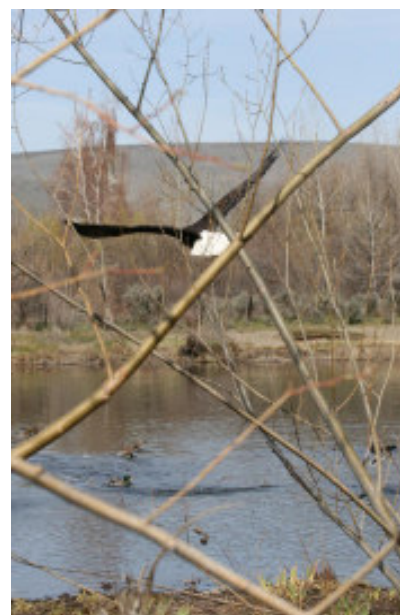
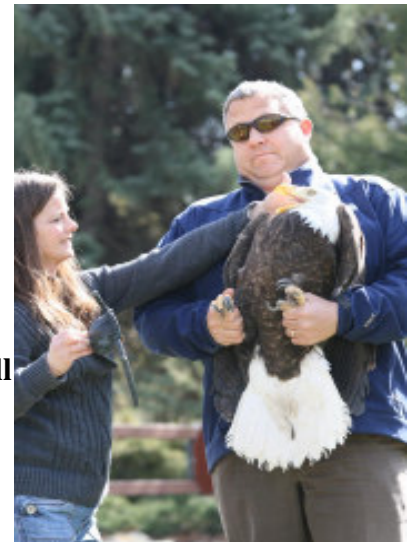

THE WAGS TO RICHES MERLIN SCHOLARSHIP WINNER SELECTED

This year Wags to Riches received 4 amazing scholarship applications and the Scholarship Committee spent a considerable amount of time evaluating the applications. Each student was worthy of being selected and the decision took some time and a lot of discussion but finally, one student emerged as a clear winner.

One of Nicole Putney's Letters of Recommendation called her a "tireless, dauntless, muteless voice for the welfare of animals and community service." In addition it said that "she is the epitome of the criteria for the award and is one of the most devoted animal welfare advocates that I have ever had the pleasure to work with."

Just one of her achievements at WSU...

As of the 2008-2009 school year, live dogs were being used in the sophomore level anesthesia and theriogenology courses and, because of lab animal care and use protocols, these animals had to be adopted internally or euthanized at the end of each course. Unfortunately, many were euthanized. Nicole took the lead to change this practice and, after many meetings with course instructors and curriculum development personnel, she succeeded in eliminating the use of these dogs from the curriculum. As of the 2009-2010 school year, dogs that are to be spayed or neutered and returned to the shelter are used, along with teaching models and videos, to educate both the anesthesia and the theriogenology students.

The Wags to Riches Merlin Scholarship Fund committee is proud to award Nicole Putney, a 3rd year student at WSU, a scholarship in the amount of \$2,000.00.

The committee is chaired by Roger Vandiver, founding Board Chair of Wags to Riches.

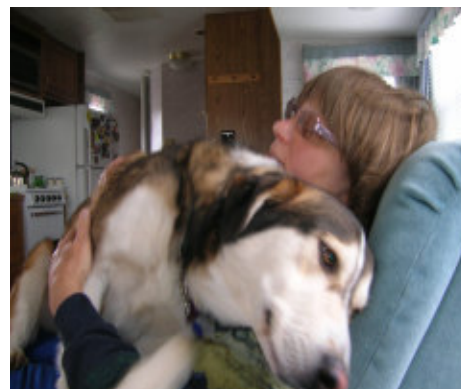
BUDDY J's LOVE STORY

I watched him wander down into a ravine at one point, and every few seconds he would lift his head and check to make sure he could see me. When I backed away from the edge so he couldn't see me, he instantly turned and ran back. On the hike we took this afternoon, there were more people, he seems to get a little protective so I started leashing him when we saw men. A few men were willing to stop and let me introduce him, then he did just fine.

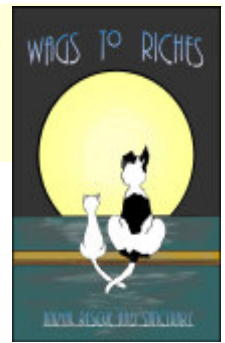
I have taken some pictures and will send another email tomorrow with pictures. No one can believe that I just got him yesterday, because he already sticks to me like glue, even when we're around other people.
